**Emergency Ultrasound:** Ultrasound is safe, rapid, non-invasive and painless. Used extensively in radiology, obstetrics and cardiology, it is now also advocated for use in Emergency Medicine. Covering the new College of Emergency Medicine (SA) guidelines and includes EFAST, AAA, Focused echo in resuscitation, DVT and central venous placement.

Target group: Clinicians working in Emergency Centres

**AIME:** Airway management involves much more than simply the placement of an endotracheal tube. AIME is a hands-on, case-based, skill-focused learning experience. Decisions of when and why to intubate, by which method, with or without pharmacologic agents and what to do when things go wrong, are all addressed.

Target group: Clinicians working in an emergency setting

**ECG master class:** Cardiac pathology (for example arrhythmias) needs quick, simple and effective assessment and management. This master class builds on knowledge of pathology, assessment, examination, treatment and care to augment the understanding and place of the ECG in the emergency environment.

Target group: Clinicians working in an emergency setting

**Hospital Disaster Planning:** This workshop will cover, amongst other topics, the importance of hospital disaster planning, how to assess the key components of a hospital disaster plan, understanding of phased disaster responses, why disaster responses fail and after action reviews.

Target group: Clinicians, nurses working in Emergency Centres, and hospital managers

**Emergency Radiology:** In the care of the emergency patient, diagnostic imaging is only as helpful as the person interpreting the image. This workshop will look at diagnostic imaging other than ultrasound which is currently available in the emergency setting and improve the interpretation and understanding thereof.
